Current Research Interests: Dr Campbell's current research interests include patient safety, risk management, and health informatics projects using VHA large-scale administrative datasets. Dr Campbell developed the VHA National Injury and Adverse Event Surveillance System to track all "harms" at the Patient Safety Center in Tampa. He is currently adapting the

Surveillance system to support CMS' Patient Safety Evaluation Systems initiatives around injurious falls, pressure ulcers, and patient handling and transfers. Part of this research effort includes developing reports from the Surveillance system that will allow VISN-level patient safety dashboards to be developed to monitor trends across time. In conjunction with the VA's Medical Legal Risk Management Research Field Advisory Council, the Surveillance system is being considered as a dashboard tool to produce reports that will support a focused medical peer review process in VA facilities and help to identify trends in potentially compensable events. With the increased emphasis on using emergency department visits and acute admissions as quality of care outcome metrics in primary care settings in the emerging VHA primary care medical home. Dr Campbell is expanding the scope of the Surveillance system to include ED and outpatient physician office visits for injuries and adverse events. To gain elderly VHA enrollee population metrics on injuries and adverse events, veteran enrollee Medicare data on injuries and adverse events will be incorporated into the Surveillance system in the near future.

Dr Campbell and colleagues at the Tampa Center of Innovation on Disability and Rehabilitation Research (CIDRR) are also developing a research program in conjunction with Stetson and Nova Southeastern's Law Schools new Veterans Legal Institute and Clinics to address the legal needs of combat polytrauma patients receiving VHA rehabilitation services, homeless veterans, and studying the use of advanced directives in veterans enrolled in palliative and hospice care.
