Veteran-Centered Outcomes Using Qualitative and Quantitative Methods (PI: Craig Velozo, PhD, OTR/L, Co-Investigators: **Elizabeth “Lisa” M. Hannold, PhD**, Craig Boylstein, PhD, Maude Rittman, PhD, RN, Andrea Behrman, PhD, PT, Janis Daly, PhD, Mary Jo Roach, PhD). This VA Collaborative Center grant was funded by VA RR&D in July 2006. The overall aim of this 2-year project was to use qualitative research methods and Item Response Theory (IRT) to modify and develop measures that reflect outcomes that are relevant to recovering Veterans and sensitive to improvements resulting from innovative gait interventions. Qualitative methods were used to collect and analyze data from Veterans enrolled in ongoing locomotor training/gait studies at VA Research Centers of Excellence in Gainesville, FL and Cleveland, OH. Qualitative data were used to build an item bank representative of Veteran-centered outcomes. Future projects will use item response theory to construct a patient-report survey of gait interventions. As a Co-Principal Investigator, I was responsible for coordinating this project. I also assisted with qualitative data collection, analyses and dissemination of study findings.

Differential Effects Vs. Manually-Assisted Locomotor Training (Principal Investigator: Andrea Behrman, PhD, PT, Co-Principal Investigator: Steve Kautz, PhD, Co-Investigators: Charles Levy, MD, Mark Bowden, PT, MS, **Elizabeth “Lisa” M.
